Costs vary for the different camps, but a \$25 deposit is required when you register for any of them. If you sign up for King's Kids, Promise Seekers, or SYC (Youth Camp), please send a message to Beth right away so we can coordinate transportation for these three camps only. All other camps require your own transportation and adult supervision.

Scholarship funds are available for everyone. You may pick up a scholarship application from the church office, or you may request one from Beth Simpson. Scholarship applications are due in the church office by **May 27**. Once scholarship money has been allocated, you will need to pay the remainder of the fee to the church one week before camp starts.
